



myIACUC Form Updated

Since the release of myIACUC version 2.0 in April, there have been several questions about the modified version which was done to improve the format and clarify certain questions. In addition, we have recently made several new corrections to questions. The following changes to questions are highlighted to clarify some of those modifications.

- 1.2.1 has moved and is now 1.1.8.
- 3.1.1 now presents animal numbers totaled by species and pain category.
- 5.4.1 is now a read only Table 24.2.1.
- 7.1.1 the surgery question has been separated into survival surgery and non-survival surgery, and the Non-Survival Surgery (Section 23) has been added as yes/no with additional questions if yes.
- 14.1.1 and 14.1.1a are combined.
- 16.1.1, 16.1.2 and 16.7.1 (Surgery) are combined into one question.
- 16.4.1, 16.9.1b and 16.9.2 (Surgery) are combined into one question.
- 16.4.3 and 16.4.3a (Surgery) are combined into one question.
- 16.5.1 and 16.8.2 (Surgery) are combined into one question.
- 17.1.1 was moved to 24.1.
- 24.2.2 is a new question added to include drugs and all other agents not previously mentioned in the protocol.

Much of the information will automatically be transferred from the questions in the old format to questions in the new. However, there will be some questions that have to be answered the next time a modification or continuation is completed for the protocol.
